

ACTIVITIES BY MILL PRONG PRESERVATION IN 2010

--presentation of the 2010 Annual Luncheon in April. In conjunction, a presentation by Dr. David Moore of the N.C. Maritime Museum on the raising of Blackbeard's Queen Anne's Revenge.

--installation of new exhibit at Mill Prong: Life at Floral College, from 1841—1878.

--installation of a copy and related exhibit of the impeachment proceedings brought against John Gilchrist, Sr (in 1797, charges were brought in the N.C. Senate against Gilchrist for taking up arms against the United States during the Revolutionary War); this copy recounts the proceedings and relates the outcome.

--addition of a 2nd file cabinet at the Scottish Heritage Center to hold the growing collection of historic and administrative records of Mill Prong and Mill Prong Preservation.

--holding monthly Open Houses and Docent tours.

--serving as the site for Board meetings of the Scotland County Highland Games, Inc., and similar meetings.

--installation of an information panel at the Scottish Heritage Center (located at St. Andrews College). The panel, entitled "Political Life of the Highland Scots and the Owners of Mill Prong House", joins other panels at the Center which chronicle the life of the Highland Scots in the Cape Fear region.

--acquisition of additional furniture for Mill Prong: a cherry secretary, a Windsor chair and Karastan multi-color rug for the front room.

--exhibition of Mill Prong information in a tent at the Scotland Co Highland Games.

--holding the Christmas Open House in December. Refreshments, period greenery, a display of Revolutionary War-era weaponry and armaments, playing of chamber music and Christmas carols by the Sandhills Consort and firing of a musket to extend Christmas greeting to neighbors all made for festive and enjoyable afternoon.
